Entry & Pen Fees

- \$20 per animal for Open Bucks, Open Senior Does and Open Junior Does to compete in all four rings
- No entry fee for Youth Show.
- Pen rentals are \$10 each for a 10'x12' open stall, or \$5 each for 5'x5' pens. Pens will not be assigned, and are available on a first come, first served basis. Tack pens may be limited to ensure adequate pens are available for goats. Entry & pen fees must accompany entry form for entries to be considered.
- Weathers Livestock arena now has a concrete floor. Pens will have base bedding, but exhibitors are encouraged to pre-order bagged shavings from the show (\$6/bag) to ensure animal comfort and cleanliness.
- Substitutions are discouraged but will be allowed within breed during specified check-in times.
- There will be no refunds of fees paid. Checks should be made payable to "Small Animal Producers" and mailed with Entry Forms to: NC Cooperative Extension, c/o Greg Traywick, 130 S. Post Road, Suite 1, Shelby, NC 28152.
- Emailed entries to gbtraywi@ncsu.edu will be accepted, but animals will not be counted in the final tally of entries or allowed to compete until the entry fees are paid in full.
- Entry deadline is **Friday, May 19, 2023**.

Show Order, Approved Sanctions and Judges

To expedite and synchronize the shows, the show order and ring assignments will be determined by show officials based on the number of entries in each breed and are subject to change. Any such changes will be posted prominently at ringside and announced in the barn prior to show time.

Class Listing

Youth Showmanship

If you plan to compete in showmanship during the YOUTH SHOW, list the appropriate class on your Entry Form

- A. Junior Showmanship: exhibitors 9 and under
- B. Intermediate Showmanship: exhibitors 10-15 years
- C. Senior Showmanship: exhibitors 16-20 years
- D. ***Non-competitive and non-sanctioned showmanship class for youth or adults with special needs. Participants are permitted to borrow an animal from another exhibitor to show in this class.***

The **Youth Combined Doe Show** will be divided by breeds according to the number of entries received, with each breed assigned to a specific judge for placing. Any changes to the show order will be posted prominently at ringside and announced in the barn prior to show time. The show is subject to all other rules and regulations as stated for the Open Shows.

- S3 - Milkers 3 Years and Under 4
- S4 – Milkers 4 Years and Under 5

ADGA Sanctioned Open Dairy Goat Shows

-Open to the World-

All Shows **ARE** sanctioned separately by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern. Only ADGA, AGS and CGS registered, recorded or applied-for animals may be shown in an official American Dairy Goat Association show.

- The base date for computing ages is the respective date of show. There is no pre-show milk-out.
- The original registration certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and **MUST** be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show.
- The original registration certificate or duplicate application stamped by the ADGA office is required for all animals under six months of age and this **MUST** be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show.
- No copies of registration certificate or the stamped duplicate application, telegrams or phone calls will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate.
- All animals entering the grounds must be healthy. Health papers are not required for animals originating in North Carolina. For out-of-state animals, health certificates are required, as well as negative brucellosis and TB tests within 30 days or herd certifications and accreditation unless animals are from states that are certified "TB and Brucellosis Free" by the USDA (check with your veterinarian).
- If your animal is awarded a GCH or RGCH, you must have your registration papers available for immediate viewing by the judge. Please verify all information on the official show sheet prior to signing the Report of Awards.
- Pens will be bedded with shavings, and additional bags of shavings will be available for purchase. The fairgrounds does not allow straw bedding.
