The Extension Master Gardener Association of Cleveland County is committed to sustainable gardening, soil health, environmental soundness, and community involvement. We support education and outreach to local growers of food, flowers, shrubs, and trees. In offering this scholarship, we hope to further the education of young people who share our values.

This \$1,000 scholarship is available to a high school senior in the Cleveland County School District who is preparing to enter post-secondary education in the fall semester following high school graduation.

To qualify, the student must:

- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher.
- Plan to major in horticulture, agriculture, plant science, botany, forestry, landscape architecture/design, or another gardening-related field.
- Include a letter of recommendation from a teacher who has taught this student within the last two years.
- Include a letter of recommendation from a non-related personal reference.
- Include a transcript listing courses taken and grades received, for seven semesters.
- Be accepted into an accredited two- or four-year college or university and be enrolled for the coming fall semester.

This application must be mailed and postmarked on or before March 1 of each year.
